"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." – 2 Timothy 3:16-17

How'd we do? At the beginning of 2024, I encouraged us all to read through a chapter of Proverbs a day—to seek God's wisdom like King Solomon did at the beginning of his kingship. True wisdom can only come from God. 1 Corinthians 1:23-24 says, "but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God." Christ is the wisdom of God. When we pursue godly wisdom, we are pursuing Christ. We are seeking to know Him and to be like Him.

So... how'd we do? More than a legalistic, check-the-box judgement on whether or not we read a chapter a day, did we actively engage in reading God's Word? Did we pursue becoming more like Christ? I'm sure if we looked back over the year, we could identify the things that got in the way—life circumstances, worries, temptations, anxieties, relationships, and more always contend for our attention. Pursuing Christlikeness is difficult. But God is not unaware of this fact. He understands what we go through. Hebrews 4:15 says, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin." Jesus understands the difficulty. He's lived it. He successfully overcame it. Now, He calls us to draw near to Him to find help to do the same.

How do we draw near to Him? How do we become equipped to pursue Christlikeness? Through His Word. Look at the verses at the top of the page. Specifically, look at the last phrase. Because of God's Word, we are equipped for every good work. It is the Bible that equips us. Through the absolute truth that it gives us, we gain the necessary tools to engage in good works—not just some good works, but every good work. If we want to be more Christlike—if we want to be the hands and feet of Christ in our relationships, workplaces, and community—then we need to be in God's Word. Our pursuit of godliness will rise and fall depending on how often we are engaging the Bible.

Of course, we still find this difficult to do. But we need to remember that whatever temporary gain (crossing an item off the task list, watching TV, getting rest, etc) we may get from leaving the Bible on the shelf doesn't compare with what we'll gain from the time we spend in God's Word. Through Scripture, we'll be trained and grow in our spiritual maturity. Nothing else holds that promise.

The encouragement is to start our year out right. Get into God's Word and read it daily. There are Bible reading plans available to pick up at the Greeter's table to help give us some structure. Commit to being in God's Word so that we can be equipped to pursue Christlikeness. That is our call this year.
